


It can happen to anybody!

You or someone close to you might be a victim.

Your friend(or daughter) who enjoys host clubs seems to have started working in the sex industry.

They might have been coerced into sex work due to heavy debt.

Persons offering accommodation for runaways on social media.



They might be targeted as victims of obscene acts.

Persons looking for a "sugar daddy" or offering prostitution service on social media.



Children might be forced or lured into engage in sexual acts.

A foreign worker saying "my passport has been taken away."



They seem to be coerced to work under exploitative conditions.
